WHEREAS, He is an amazing artist/historian and has produced plays and oral histories of the labor movement, most notably *53 Days*,

WHEREAS, He is a distinguished Executive Member of the United Association of Labor Educators (UALE),

WHEREAS, Bill leads his life with the utmost love and dedication for working people and for everyone around him, including his students, fellow activists, his neighbors, fellow AFT 2121 members and his family,
